

Nancy E. O'Malley is the District Attorney for Alameda County. She was appointed to the position on September 15, 2009 and was elected in June, 2010. Ms. O'Malley is the first woman to serve as Alameda County's District Attorney. She is the Immediate Past President of the California Women Lawyers and Vice-President of Women Lawyers of Alameda County. Ms. O'Malley serves on the Advisory Board of the National Family Justice Center Alliance and oversees the Alameda County Family Justice Center.

From 1999-2009, she served as the Chief Assistant District Attorney. Ms. O'Malley is a nationally recognized expert in issues involving Violence Against Women and interpersonal violence, including sexual assault, domestic violence, elder abuse, child abuse, stalking/threat management. Ms. O'Malley has produced numerous training programs and has written several legal articles related to child physical and sexual abuse, and violence against women. She serves as the Technical Advisor for the Sexual Assault Training through the California District Attorney's Association (CDAA) and produced the first statewide Symposium on Violence Against Women. She has produced the statewide 3R Conference which addresses issues affecting teens, particularly sexual assault of teens, teen health and HIV awareness.

Ms. O'Malley is the current Chair of the California Sex Offender Management Board and was a member of the collaborative who created the Statewide Strategic Plan for ending Sexual Violence in California. She is Chair of the CDAA Sexual Assault Committee and serves on the Domestic Violence, Elder Abuse and Victim's Rights Committees. Ms. O'Malley's State-wide Task Force service includes: the Violence Against Women Task Force, the California Sexual Assault Victim Services and Prevention Program State Advisory Committee and the Domestic Violence Advisory Committee. Ms. O'Malley serves on the California Judicial Council's Criminal Law Advisory Committee and also the Administrative Office of the Court's Violence Against Women Educational Project. She serves on the Sheriff's Advisory Committee for the MOMS program and previously, served on the Children and Youth Cabinet of the United Way of the Bay Area. Ms. O'Malley has written several bills which have been signed into law, including the expansion of protections for victims of Sexual Assault, Domestic Violence, Stalking, Elder Abuse as well as stronger protections for child victims and crime victims with disabilities. She serves as both a National and Statewide consultant to Legislators on pending legislation, including issues of Victim's Rights, Violence Against Women, and Sentencing.

Under her leadership and vision, Alameda County opened the **Alameda County Family Justice Center**, a one-stop shop for victims of family violence, sexual assault, elder abuse, sexual exploitation of minors and child abuse. The ACFJC is a model throughout the country. The ACFJC serves as the Northern California Regional Training Center for the California Family Justice Initiative, a project funded by Blue Shield Foundation. Ms. O'Malley serves as the Technical Advisor to the Project.

Ms. O'Malley is known for her innovation and vision. She created a diversion program so that sexually and commercially exploited minors who are arrested for prostitution are now treated as victims of sexual abuse and exploitation. She has developed technology as a means to deliver services more effectively and efficiently, such as electronic notification to victims of crime as to future court dates. She has created a Restitution Program that is a model for the State; in 2009, the Alameda County District Attorneys Office obtained more than \$10,000,000 in direct restitution orders for victims and the State of California who have expended funds on behalf of crime victims. In 2010, Ms. O'Malley created H.E.A.T. Watch, (human exploitation and trafficking) which is a model blueprint for communities to combat human trafficking and the sexual and commercial sexual exploitation of minors. H.E.A.T. Watch received the 2010 Program of the Year by the National Association of County (NaCo).

Ms. O'Malley is honored to have received several awards for her contributions to the community and her profession. In 2010, Ms. O'Malley was honored as District Attorney of the Year by Crime Victims Action Alliance; she also received the Carondelet High School's 2010 Alumna of the Year Award.

In 2007, she received the *Professional Achievement Award* from CDAA's Violence Against Women Project as well as the *Allied Professional Appreciation Award* from Alameda County Health Care. In 2004, Ms. O'Malley was inducted into the *Alameda County Women's Hall of Fame, Justice Category*. In

2003, Ms. O'Malley was honored with the following awards: the *Liz Figueroa Domestic Violence Prevention Award* from SAVE, the *Outstanding Manager of the Year Award* in Health Care Services by the Alameda County Managers Affiliation for her work in coordinating the Sexual Assault Response Teams and the *Special Agent Michiel Blamey Memorial Award for Career Achievement Award* by the California Sexual Assault Investigators Association. In 2002, Ms. O'Malley received the *Outstanding Recognition of Service Award by the California Victim-Witness Coordinating Council*. In 2000, she was honored with the *Governor's Victims Services Award* for her exceptional dedication and outstanding leadership in advancing victims' rights and in 1999, Ms. O'Malley was awarded the *Morton Bard Allied Professional Award by the National Organization of Victim Advocates (NOVA)*. In 1998, she was honored by the California Senate with the *Woman of the Year* award for her leadership in ending Violence Against Women and for her legislative contributions. She has been honored by the YMCA of the East Bay for the creation, of FutureChoice, a teen-based program to build self-esteem and, life skills. In May, 2005, she was selected as one of six "*Women to Watch*" by Diablo Magazine.
